

# unattended-upgrades

Un paquet est volontairement créé pour cette fonction de mise à jour automatique des paquets : unattended-upgrades

```
apt install unattended-upgrades apt-listchanges
```

Ajouter la notification mail à chaque upgrade en décommentant la ligne suivante dans le fichier /etc/apt/apt.conf.d/50unattended-upgrades

Le fichier /etc/apt/apt.conf.d/50unattended-upgrades est présent. La partie suivante précise ce qu'on souhaite upgrader automatiquement. Le minimum à décocher sont les mises à jour de sécurité.
